Read On Book Talk Rubric

What is a book talk?

A book talk is a 3 to 7 minute oral presentation about your book to a group of students. Visual aids are welcome! Do not simply read from notes; engage your audience using eye contact and a loud, clear voice. This is practice for your portfolio presentations and future public speaking engagements. A book talk should include:

- 1. The title, author, genre and summary of the book you read.
- 2. A passage that you loved.
- 3. A personal response to the book--- what did you get out of this book and why would you recommend it?
- 4. Anything else you would like to say about your book.
- 5. You may choose to present your book talk to just your advisory, or to the whole school during morning meeting.
